### Terms and Conditions

This letter constitutes your formal offer of a **College place** at Wadham College. We ask you to carefully read the enclosed letter from the College, which provides further details of its key Terms and Conditions, and of your commitments to the College on entrance.

The University will make you a formal offer of a **University place** through UCAS by the end of January. The offer on UCAS will contain a link to the University's Terms and Conditions and other documents which you must read carefully. Please note that if you have an offer for deferred entry, your contract will be set out in the Terms and Conditions and other documents for your cohort which will be published next January. You will be emailed a link to these once they are online.

When you accept the offer through UCAS as your "Firm Choice" you will enter into your contract with the University. The content of that contract and your responsibilities under it are explained in the Terms and Conditions.

As a condition of accepting your University offer you must also declare any unspent relevant criminal convictions, to be dealt with under the University's policy:

this by mid-January and also giving details of someone to contact if you need any help or guidance. It is also a condition of your University offer that any information submitted with or in relation to your application (whether to UCAS, the University or your college) is true, genuine, accurate and complete (i.e. does not omit information you have been asked to provide). The consequences of failing to meet the conditions of this offer are set out in your Terms & Conditions.

In particular, if you satisfy your conditions you will be sent a pack of information in late August 2020 (2021 for deferred offers). This will include a college contract, which you will be asked to sign and return as a condition of entry.
